REF: August Safety Meeting

1. Standard Traffic Ordinance (STO) and Uniform Public Offense Code (UPOC) – Each year the League of Kansas Municipalities reviews the various Kansas Statutes that have been changed by the legislature. Books are produced for Kansas municipalities that may be adopted by reference so that the city does not have to do the research and publish their own city codes. The City of Roeland Park has used the STO and UPOC books for a number of years and has adopted the new books annually to remain current with state law.

This year the STO has several changes to include a change to allow the removal of crashed vehicles from the roadway under certain circumstances, Fleeing or attempting to Elude a Police Officer, Unlawful operation of a golf cart, Unlawful operation of a work-sit utility vehicle and driving in violation of restrictions. The ordinance that adopts the STO has one minor change. The no parking in front of Roesland School has been extended 150 feet south of the school drive. This was at the request of the principal and was done at the end of last school year as a temporary measure.

The UPOC has some changes and clarifications from last year to include Stalking, Unlawful hosting of a minor alcohol party, Unlawful selling of scrap metal, Criminal use of Weapons, Criminal Disposal of Firearms and Cockfighting.

The city attorney will draft ordinances to adopt both manuals at the August 17th council meeting. I recommend that we keep the same additions to the manuals that we have in the past and adopt the manuals in full. A copy of both manuals will be available for review at the Safety Meeting.

2. User Agreement with Overland Park – The city entered into an agreement with Overland Park 4 years ago to allow the police department access to Overland Park's record management system. Overland Park has revised that agreement based on the addition of other departments and experience with the operation of the system. I've met with Overland Park officials and reviewed the draft agreement. The changes to the agreement have made the sharing and funding of the project more equitable to all user agencies.

The city attorney has reviewed the agreement and says it "looks fine". I recommend that the council approve the User Agreement between The City of Roeland Park and The City of Overland Park for the use of the Intergraph Computer Software System and authorize the mayor to sign. A copy of the agreement is available at city hall and will be available at the safety meeting.

**CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS
ORDINANCE NO. 838**

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2009; AMENDING AND REPEALING EXISTING SECTIONS 14-101, 14-102, 14-103 AND 14-220 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. Section 14-101 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

14-101. INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas, that certain standard traffic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2009, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas, save and except such sections as are hereafter modified or changed, such incorporation being authorized by K.S.A. 12-3009 through 12-3012, inclusive, as amended. At least one copy of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 838," with all sections or portions thereof intended to be changed clearly marked to show any such change, and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the City charged with enforcement of the ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the City, such number of official copies of such Standard Traffic Ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

SECTION 2. Section 14-102 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

14-102. SAME; AMENDMENT TO SECTION 2. Section 2 of the Standard Traffic Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

Provisions of Ordinance Refer to Vehicles Upon the Streets and Highways and Other Designated Areas; Exceptions.

- (a) The provisions of this ordinance relating to the parking and other operation of vehicles refer exclusively to the parking and operation of vehicles upon streets and highways and upon any publicly owned property within this city except: (1) where a different place is specifically referred to in a given section; and (2) the provisions of Sections 29 through 31,

inclusive, of this ordinance, and the provisions of Article 10 of Chapter 8 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, and any acts amendatory thereof, shall apply upon streets and highways and elsewhere throughout the city.

(b) As used in subsection (a) above, the phrase "publicly owned property" shall mean property owned by the City of Roeland Park or any agency thereof or by any other political or taxing subdivision of the State of Kansas, including, but not limited to, U.S.D. No. 512, Johnson County Library, and Johnson County Parks and Recreation.

SECTION 3. Section 14-103 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:

14-103. SAME; SUPPLEMENT TO SECTION 33. The Governing Body having determined upon the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that the speed limits permitted under state law and Section 33 of the Standard Traffic Ordinance are less than reasonable and safe on some streets and are more than reasonable and safe on other streets, and does determine and declare that the speed limit (except when a special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with Section 32) on the streets hereinafter set forth be the limits specified in this section, and no person shall drive a vehicle at a speed in excess of such maximum limits:

(a) Speed not in excess of 20 miles per hour shall be lawful on the following streets:

- (1) Reinhardt from 53rd Street to 48th Street;
- (2) 50th Street from Mission Road to Reinhardt; and
- (3) Pawnee between 50th Street and Reinhardt.

(b) Except as stated below, a speed not in excess of 30 miles per hour shall be lawful for traffic upon Mission Road; Roe Lane; Johnson Drive; 53rd Street from Mission Road to Reinhardt; and 47th Street from Fontana to Mission Road. Provided, a speed not in excess of 20 miles per hour shall be lawful upon Mission Road from a point 300 feet north of 51st Street to 53rd Street during the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on days when school is in session. Provided further, a speed not in excess of 20 miles per hour shall be lawful upon Mission Road from 48th Street to 49th Terrace during the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on days when school is in session.

(c) A speed not in excess of 20 miles per hour shall be lawful upon the following streets during the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and from 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. on days when school is in session: Elledge Drive from a point 100 feet west of Clark Drive to a point 100 feet east of Parish Drive; Parish Drive from Elledge Drive to a point 100 feet south of 48th Street; Clark Drive from Elledge

Drive to a point 100 feet south of the south property line of Roesland Elementary School; and 48th Street from Parish Drive to a point 150 feet east of Parish Drive.

(d) A speed not in excess of 35 miles per hour shall be lawful on Highway 56 (Shawnee Mission Parkway) and on Roe Boulevard within the city.

(e) On any residential street not otherwise herein designated, a speed not exceeding 25 miles per hour shall be lawful.

(f) The maximum speed in other areas or on streets not specifically designated in this Section shall be as specified in § 33 of the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2009.

SECTION 4. Section 14-220 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

14-220. PARKING PROHIBITED ON CERTAIN CITY STREETS. No person shall stop, stand or park a motor vehicle except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with direction of a police officer or traffic control device in any of the following places:

- (a) On the east side of Nall Avenue from the south city limits to 51st Street;
- (b) On the south side of 51st Street from Briar to Nall Avenue;
- (c) On the south side of 56th Street, between the intersections of Granada and Roe Boulevard;
- (d) On any portion of the north side of 51st Street from Cedar to Nall Avenue;
- (e) On the west side of Buena Vista on any portion of the street;
- (f) On any portion of Roe Lane;
- (g) On the east side of Reinhardt Street between the intersections of 48th Street and 50th Terrace; and between the intersection of Lucas Lane and 53rd Street;
- (h) On either side of 50th Street between the intersections of Reinhardt and Canterbury;
- (i) On any portion of 47th Street;
- (j) On the west side of Ash from the intersection of 51st to a point 100 feet south of that intersection;
- (k) On the west side of Neosho at the intersection of Neosho and 50th Street and Wells Drive, to a point 170 feet north of the crosswalk crossing Neosho at that intersection;

- (l) On any portion of Roe Boulevard;
- (m) On the west side of Parish Drive from the intersection of Elledge Drive and Parish Drive to a point 150 feet south the entrance of the Roesland Elementary School parking lot;
- (n) On the north side of 50th Street between Clark Drive and Buena Vista Drive;
- (o) On the west side of Rosewood Drive north of the intersection with 51st Street;
- (p) On the west side of Reinhardt between 50th Terrace and 52nd Place;
- (q) On the east side of Parish from 48th Street to a point 250 feet north of that intersection;
- (r) On either side of 55th Street between Linden and Roe Boulevard;
- (s) On either side of Ash from Johnson Drive to 58th Street;
- (t) On either side of 50th Terrace between Briar and Roe Boulevard.

SECTION 5. Existing Sections 14-101, 14-102, 14-103 and 14-220 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect upon its publication in the official City newspaper.

**CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS
ORDINANCE NO. 839**

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PUBLIC OFFENSES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES" EDITION OF 2009, WITH CERTAIN ADDITIONS; AMENDING AND REPEALING EXISTING SECTION 11-101 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ROELAND PARK, KANSAS:

SECTION 1. Existing Section 11-101 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

11-101. INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2009, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas with certain additions as are provided in Article 2 of this Chapter XI. At least one copy of said Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 839," and to which shall be attached a copy of this Ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk, to be open for inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours. The police department, municipal judge and all administrative departments of the City charged with the enforcement of this ordinance shall be supplied, at the cost of the City, such number of official copies of the ordinance similarly marked, as may be deemed expedient.

SECTION 2. Existing Section 11-201 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas shall be considered to be an addition to the Uniform Public Offense Code.

SECTION 3. Existing Section 11-202 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas shall be considered to be an addition to the Uniform Public Offense Code.

SECTION 4. Existing Section 11-203 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas shall be considered to be an addition to the Uniform Public Offense Code.

SECTION 5. Existing Section 11-204 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas shall be considered to be an addition to the Uniform Public Offense Code.

SECTION 6. Existing Section 11-101 of the Code of the City of Roeland Park, Kansas is hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its publication in the official City newspaper.
